The author of this Trinitarian text is unknown, but this hymn has proved popular since the middle of the 18th century, partly because of its effective use of biblical metaphors, but also because of the strength of this tune, which was composed especially for these words.



Prelude and Fugue in A Minor

Johann Caspar Simon

The flowers in the sanctuary are given to the glory of God and in loving memory of Joess and Adrian Trimble by Tanna and Vidal Davis.



This hymn by a 19th-century Scottish pastor is specifically based on Revelation 1:7 and 22:20, with allusions to several other New Testament passages. Unlike medieval hymns that focused on judgment, this text understands the Second Coming as an occasion of triumph and joy.

Music Notes: The Prelude this morning is *Intrada No.* 2 by British composer, organist, and teacher Herbert Howells (1892-1983). The Anthem at the Offertory is *Dear Lord and Father of Mankind* set here as an anthem of the original hymn tune by Sir Charles Hubert Hastings Parry (1848-1918). Parry is best known for his rousing Coronation Anthem *I was Glad*, sung at every English coronation since being composed. Sir Parry was not only a prolific choral composer, but also a teacher and historian of music, as well as being a 1st Baronet. The Postlude is *Prelude and Fugue in A Minor* by German baroque composer Johann Caspar Simon (1701-1776).
